³²"Do not be afraid, little flock, for your Father has been pleased to give you the kingdom.

Definition

Triumphal means involving, relating to, or celebrating a triumph—an especially significant or noteworthy victory or success.

Luke 9:51 (NIV)

51 As the time approached for him to be taken up to heaven, <u>Jesus</u> <u>resolutely set out for Jerusalem</u>

Luke 19:28 (NIV)

28 After Jesus had said this, he went on ahead, going up to Jerusalem.

Luke 19:38 (NIV)

32 They were on their way up to Jerusalem, with Jesus leading the way, and the disciples were astonished, while those who followed were afraid. Again he took the Twelve aside and told them what was going to happen to him.

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Lessons From the Donkey and Her Owner



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Triumonal Entry REQUIRES BEING SET APART FOR JESUS



Luke 19:30 (NIV)

30 "Go to the village ahead of you, and as you enter it, you will find a colt tied there, which no one has ever ridden. Untie it and bring it here.

1 Peter 2:9 (NIV)

9 But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's special possession, that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light.

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Triumphal Entry

REQUIRES GIVING
IT TO JESUS WHOLEHEARTEDLY



Luke 19:30-31 (NIV)

30 "Go to the village ahead of you, and as you enter it, you will find a colt tied there, which no one has ever ridden. **Untie it and bring it here**. 31 If anyone asks you, 'Why are you untying it?' say, 'The Lord needs it."

Luke 19:33-34 (NIV)

33 As they were untying the colt, its owners asked them, "Why are you untying the colt?" 34They replied, "The Lord needs it."

Mark 11:3 (NIV)

3 If anyone asks you, 'Why are you doing this?' say, 'The Lord needs it and will send it back here shortly."

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Lessons From the Disciples



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REQUIRES GOING OBEDIENTLY

FOR JESUS



Luke 19:29-30 (NIV)

29 As he approached Bethphage and Bethany at the hill called the Mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples, saying to them, 30 "Go to the village ahead of you, and as you enter it, you will find a colt tied there, which no one has ever ridden. Untie it and bring it here.

Isaiah 6:8 (NIV)

8 Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send? And who will go for us?" And I said, "Here am I. Send me!"

Luke 19:32 (NIV)

32 Those who were sent ahead went and found it just as he had told them.

Luke 22:13 (NIV)

13 They left and **found things just as Jesus had told them**. So they prepared the Passover.

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REQUIRES CREATING A PLATFORM

FOR JESUS



Luke 19:35 (NIV)

35 They brought it to Jesus, threw their cloaks on the colt and put Jesus on it.

Luke 19:38 (NIV)

9 Rejoice greatly, Daughter Zion! Shout, Daughter Jerusalem! See, your king comes to you, righteous and victorious, <u>lowly and riding on a donkey</u>, on a colt, the foal of a donkey.

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Triumphal Entry Requires Welcoming Jesus as the King



Luke 19:36 (NIV)

36 As he went along, people spread their cloaks on the road.

2 Kings 9:13 (NIV)

13 They quickly took their cloaks and spread them under him on the bare steps. Then they blew the trumpet and shouted, "Jehu is king!"

Luke 19:38 (NIV)

38 "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord!" "Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!"

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REQUIRES PRAISING JESUS AS MESSIAH



Luke 19:37 (NIV)

37 When he came near the place where the road goes down the Mount of Olives, the whole crowd of disciples began joyfully to praise God in loud voices for all the miracles they had seen:

Luke 19:38 (NIV)

38 "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord!" "Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!"

Psalm 118:26 (NIV)

26 <u>Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.</u> From the house of the Lord we bless you.

Matthew 21:9 (ESV)

9 And the crowds that went before him and that followed him were shouting, "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!"

Psalm 22:3 (NKJV)

3 But You are holy, Enthroned in the praises of Israel.

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Lessons From the Pharises and Jerusalem



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REQUIRES IGNORING YOUR CRITICS FOR THE WORK OF JESUS



Luke 19:39 (NIV)

39 <u>Some of the Pharisees</u> in the crowd said to Jesus, "Teacher, rebuke your disciples!"

John 2:17 (NIV)

17 His disciples remembered that it is written: "Zeal for your house will consume me."

Galatians 2:20 (NIV)

20 I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. The life I now live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me.

Matthew 21:14-16 (ESV)

14 And the blind and the lame came to him in the temple, and he healed them. 15 But when the chief priests and the scribes saw the wonderful things that he did, and the children crying out in the temple, "Hosanna to the Son of David!" they were indignant, 16 and they said to him, "Do you hear what these are saying?" And Jesus said to them, "Yes; have you never read, "Out of the mouth of infants and nursing babies you have prepared praise'?"

Psalm 8:2 (NIV)

2 Through the praise of children and infants you have <u>established a</u> <u>stronghold against your enemies</u>, to silence the foe and the avenger.

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REQUIRES KNOWING THE TIME OF YOUR VISITATION



Luke 19:41–42 (NIV)

41 As he approached Jerusalem and saw the city, he wept over it 42 and said, "If you, even you, had only known on this day what would bring you peace—but now it is hidden from your eyes.
